PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-67694 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to William E. and Mildred Tucker of Box 24 Quines Creek Road, Azalea Oregon 97410, phone 837-3335, for the construction of Tucker Reservoir and storage of water from Quines Creek, a tributary of Cow Creek to be appropriated under Application 67695, Permit 49241 for supplemental irrigation,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: Dam - NW 1/4 SW 1/4 and SW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 26, Township 32 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

The maximum height will be 8.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 8.0 , slope of upstream face 3:1 , slope of downstream face 2:1 , and height of dam above water line when full 3.0 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 1.0 acres , and the maximum depth of water will be 10.0 feet

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: 12 inch culvert through dam; the distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway will be 3.0 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The dam is out of the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 6.2 acre-feet

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is March 18, 1985

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April~8,~1986 diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 87 .
