PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-68249 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Donald Flower of 4600 Little Applegate Road, Jacksonville, Oregon 97530, phone 899-7575, for the construction of an unnamed reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed swale and Little Applegate River, a tributary of Little Applegate River and Applegate River to be appropriated under Application 68250, Permit 49259 for stockwater and supplemental irrigation, being 0.1 acre-foot for * The dam will be LOCATED in the: SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 19, Township 39 South, Range 2 West, WM, in the County of Jackson.

The maximum height will be 3.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 20.0, slope of upstream face 5:1, slope of downstream face 2.5:1, and height of dam above water line when full 1.5 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.057 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 5.25 feet

* stockwater and 0.2 af for supplemental irrigation,
** af from Little Applegate River

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: None.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: 10 inch trickle tube - west end 4 inch trickle tube - east end.

The dam is out of the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 0.3 acre-foot during the period between November 1 and March 31 of any year, being 0.15 af from the unnamed swale and 0.15** The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is January 3, 1985.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 25, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 87.
