PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R=65654 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to United States, Malheur National Forest of John Day, Oregon 97845, phone 575-1731, for the construction of R.R. Springs Reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed stream, a tributary of Shirtail Creek for livestock use, and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored water when determined by the Water Resources Director * The dam will be LOCATED in the: SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 2, Township 17 South, Range 31 East, WM, within the County of Grant.

The maximum height will be 8.5 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 8.0 , slope of upstream face 3:1 , slope of downstream face 2:1 , and height of dam above water line when full 2.5 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.06 acres , and the maximum depth of water will be 6.0 feet

* to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The dimensions of the spillway are: The bottom width of the spillway will be 5.0 feet. The top width of the spillway will be 11.0 feet. The distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway will be 2.5 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The dam is in channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 0.2 acre-feet.

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is August 26, 1983

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 14, 1986 diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86.
