PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-68440 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Thomas C. Gant of PO Box 765, Bandon, Oregon 97411, phone 347-3029, for the enlargement of Reservoir 2 constructed under Permit R-6536 and storage of water from Johnson Creek, a tributary of Pacific Ocean, to be appropriated under Application 68441, Permit 49491, for irrigation, temperature control and flood harvesting,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: NE 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 8, Township 29 South, Range 14 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

The maximum height will be 9.5 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 10.0, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 2:1, and height of dam above water line when full n/a

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.22 acres, and the maximum depth of water will be 9.5 feet

* nonirrigation season or when excess water is otherwise available.

The dimensions of the spillway are: None; reservoir is drained during winter months.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: 12 inch CMP with drop boards.

The dam is in the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 2.0 acre-feet, being 0.9 af for irrigation, 0.9 af for temperature control, and 0.2 af for flood harvesting annually during the *
The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is July 16, 1985

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 15, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 87.
