PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-68348 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to William J. Pullen of Route 2, Box 230, Bandon, Oregon 97411, phone 347-2087, for the construction of the Simpson Creek a tributary of Coquille River Reservoir 1 enlargement an storage of water from Simpson Creek to be appropriated under Application 68349, Permit 49555 for temperature control, flood harvesting and irrigation, being 0.6 af for temperature control, 2.0 af for flood harvesting, and *

The dam will be LOCATED in the: NW 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 20, Township 28 South, Range 14 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

The maximum height will be 9.9 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 12.0 feet, slope of upstream face 0.5:1, slope of downstream face 0.5:1, and height of dam above water line when full 4.0 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 1.5 acres, and the maximum depth of water will be 12.0 feet

* 0.6 af for irrigation,

The dimensions of the spillway are: The bottom width of the spillway will be 4.4 feet. The top width of the spillway will be 4.4 feet. The distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway will be 3.0 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: 18 inch steel pipe at bottom of dam.

The dam is in the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 3.2 acre-feet annually during the nonirrigation season or when excess water is otherwise available.

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is October 11, 1985.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 16, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1987.
