PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-68443 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife of 506 SW Mill, Portland, Oregon, 97201, phone 229-5701, for the construction of Eel Lake Reservoir and storage of water from Eel Creek, a tributary of Ten Mile Creek, for fish rearing, to be maintained by appropriation under Application 68444, Permit 49610,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: NE 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 6, Township 23 South, Range 12 West, in the County of Coos.

The maximum height will be 9.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 60.0 feet, slope of upstream face vertical, slope of downstream face vertical and height of dam above water line when full 3.5 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 350 acres, and the maximum depth of water will be 1.0 feet

The dimensions of the spillway are: The bottom width of the spillway will be 40.0 feet. The top width of the spillway will be 40.0 feet. The distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway will be 3.5 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: 4.0 feet wide and 6.0 feet high located in the fish trap.

The dam is in the channel.

The dam will be steel sheet piling construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 350.0 acre-feet annually during the nonirrigation season or when excess water is otherwise available.
The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is January 10, 1986.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 9, 1987, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1987.
