PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-68939 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Wallace L. Preble of 13805 NW Thompson Road, Portland, Oregon, 97229, phone 645-1520, for the construction of a reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed drainageway, for livestock.

The dam will be LOCATED in the: NE 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 28, Township 1 North, Range 1 West, WM, in the County of Washington.

The maximum height will be N/A feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be N/A, slope of upstream face N/A, slope of downstream face N/A, and height of dam above water line when full N/A

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be N/A, and the maximum depth of water will be N/A.

The dam is out of the channel.

The reservoir was created completely by excavation and the material removed was placed adjacent to the reservoir.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 4.5 acre-feet annually during the nonirrigation season or when excess water is otherwise available.
The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is October 6, 1986.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 30, 1988, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1988.
