PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-68826 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Kerry Dean Bredenkamp of 37001 Bear Creek Lane, Boring, Oregon, 97009, phone 668-5130, for the construction of Bear Creek Hatchery Reservoir and storage of water from Bear Creek, a tributary of Sandy River, to be maintained by appropriation under Application 68963, Permit 49931, for raising fish.

The dam will be LOCATED in the: SE 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 26, Township 1 South, Range 4 East, WM, in the County of Clackamas.

The maximum height will be 5.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 15.0 feet , slope of upstream face 3:1 , slope of downstream face 2:1 , and height of dam above water line when full 5.0 feet.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.25 acre , and the maximum depth of water will be 8.0 feet.

Concrete raceway with flashboard control

The dimensions of the spillway are: The width of the spillway will be 5.0 feet. Maximum depth will be 5.0 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The dam is in the channel.

The dam will be concrete and flashboard construction.

All flashboards to be removed from spillway during the period from October 1 to April 1 of each year.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 1.0 acre-foot annually during the nonirrigation season or when excess water is otherwise available. The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is December 12, 1986.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 31, 1988, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1988.
