PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-69083 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Waverley Country Club of 1100 Waverley Drive, Milwaukie, Oregon 97222, phone 654-6521, for the construction of a reservoir and storage of water from the Willamette River to be appropriated under Application 69084, Permit 50092 for irrigation.

The dam will be LOCATED in the: SE1/4 NW1/4 of Section 26, Township 1 South, Range 1 East, W.M., in the County of Clackamas.

n/a The maximum height will be feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be n/a , slope of upstream face Π/a , and height of dam above water line when full 2.0 feet

0.6 acre The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be , and the maximum depth of water will be 8.0 feet

The dimensions of the spillway are: There will be none.

The location and dimensions of the outlet conduit will be: none.

The reservoir will be out of the channel.

The reservoir will be a combination irrigation water storage pond and golf course water hazard. It is to be constructed by excavating existing rough areas. The reservoir is to be entirely excavated.

* for water hazard and 0.77 cfs for irrigation.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 2.77 acre-feet annually during the nonirrigation season or when excess water is otherwise available, being 2.0 af* The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is May 6, 1987

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 30, 1988 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 89 .
