PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-68831 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Lillian M. Dishion and Mardell J. Mathews of 500 Wilson Road, Mosier, Oregon 97040, phone 478-3762, for the construction of Lillian Reservoir and storage of water from Mosier Creek, a tributary of the Columbia River, to be maintained by appropriation of water under Application 68832, Permit 50169, for fish rearing.

The dam will be LOCATED in the: NW1/4 NW1/4 of Section 19, Township 2 North, Range 12 East, W.M., in the County of Wasco.

The maximum height will be 6.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 12.0 feet, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 3:1, and height of dam above water line when full 1.0 feet,

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.75 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 6.5 feet.

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: None. There will be a 6 inch PVC overflow pipe to control water level and exhaust the excess water back to Mosier Creek.

The location and dimensions of the outlet conduit will be: none.

The dam will be out of the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 2.5 acre-feet annually during the nonirrigation season or when excess water is otherwise available.

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is August 19, 1986, for storage of 1.5 af and February 3, 1987, for storage of 1.0 af.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 28, 1989, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 89.
