is hereby issued a permit to construct two reservoirs to store the waters from AN UNNAMED STREAM, a tributary of CAMAS CREEK, for LIVESTOCK. The permit to store these waters is granted under Reservoir Application R-67163. The priority of the permit dates from OCTOBER 3, 1983. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year under such right, for the purposes aforesaid, shall not exceed 0.16 ACRE-FOOT, BEING 0.10 AF IN POND 22 and 0.06AF IN POND 23.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored water when determined by the Water Resources Director to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The dams will be located in the:

1 SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 30 T 4 S R 33 E, WM;

The maximum height will be 3.00 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 4.0 feet, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 3:1, and height of dam above water line when full 2.0 feet. The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.05 acre and the maximum depth of water will be 5.0 feet.

2 LOT 2 (SW1/4 NW1/4) Section 31 T 4 S R 33 E, WM;

The maximum height will be 5.00 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 4.0 feet, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 3:1, and height of dam above water line when full 2.0 feet. The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.04 acre and the maximum depth of water will be 4.0 feet.

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Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 10, 1989, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1990.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water. By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan. It is possible that the land use you propose may not be allowed if it is not in keeping with the goals and the acknowledged plan. Your city or county planning agency can advise you about the land-use plan in your area.
