PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

is hereby issued a permit to construct BURR RESERVOIR and store waters from WEST BRANCH ASH SWALE, A TRIBUTARY OF SALT CREEK, TO BE APPROPRIATED UNDER APPLICATION 69400, PERMIT 50414 for IRRIGATION. The permit to store these waters is granted under Reservoir Application R-69474 with a date of priority of NOVEMBER 23, 1987. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year under such right, for the purposes aforesaid, shall not exceed 22.0 ACRE-FEET.

This permit is subject to the conditions that follow:

1. The structure shall be operated and maintained in accordance with the approved plans & specifications and with the design intent.
2. The outlet gate shall be cycled at least once each year in order to assure smooth operation.
3. The embankment and spillway channel shall be kept clear of trees, brush and other debris.
4. The embankment shall be kept free of burrowing animals.

The dam will be located in the:

N1/2, Section 34, T 6 S, R 5 W, WM;

The maximum height will be 22.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 12.0 feet, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 3:1, and height of dam above water line when full 3.5 feet. The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 22.0 acres and the maximum depth of water will be 15.5 feet.

The area submerged by the reservoir is located in:

1/4 1/4 SECTION TOWNSHIP RANGE, WM

This development was reviewed and considered by the Water Resources Commission on October 28, 1988.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 29, 1989, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1990.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water. By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan. It is possible that the land use you propose may not be allowed if it is not in keeping with the goals and the acknowledged plan. Your city or county planning agency can advise you about the land-use plan in your area.
