is hereby issued a permit to CONSTRUCT RESERVOIR 2 AND STORE WATERS FROM CONNER'S CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF DAVIS CREEK, TO BE APPROPRIATED UNDER APPLICATION 69545, PERMIT 50446, for IRRIGATION, TEMPERATURE CONTROL AND FLOOD HARVESTING OF CRANBERRIES.

The permit to store these waters is granted under Reservoir Application R-69544 with a date of priority of MARCH 3, 1988. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year under such right, for the purposes aforesaid, shall not exceed 8.5 ACRE-FEET, BEING 4.25 ACRE-FEET FOR IRRIGATION, 1.27 ACRE-FEET FOR TEMPERTURE CONTROL AND 2.98 ACRE-FEET FOR FLOOD HARVESTING.

This permit is subject to the conditions as follows:

- 1. Installation and maintenance of a gate valve or other suitable mechanism in the lowest flashboard approved by the Watermaster for regulating the water.
- 2. All flashboards to be removed from the spillway during the period from October 1 to April 1 of each year.

The dam will be located in the:

SE 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 12, T 30 S, R 15 W, WM;

The maximum height will be 9.00 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 20.0 feet, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 2:1, and height of dam above water line when full 2.5 feet. The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 1.42 acre and the maximum depth of water will be 9.9 feet.

The area submerged by the reservoir is located in:

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 31, 1990, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1990.
