The permit to store these waters is granted under Reservoir Application R-69458 with a date of priority of NOVEMBER 12, 1987. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year under such right, for the purposes aforesaid, shall not exceed 2.5 ACRE-FEET, BEING 0.5 AF IN RESERVOIR 1 AND 2.0 AF IN RESERVOIR 2.

The dams will be located in the:

1 NW 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 2, T 23 S, R 6 W, WM;

The maximum height will be 9.50 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 10.0 feet, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 2:1, and height of dam above water line when full 2.5 feet. The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.1 acre and the maximum depth of water will be 6.0 feet.

2 NE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 2, T 23 S, R 6 W, WM;

The maximum height will be 8.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 15.0 feet, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 2:1, and height of dam above water line when full 2.5 feet. The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.25 acre and the maximum depth of water will be 8.0 feet.
