### PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

is hereby issued a permit to construct CONNER'S CREEK, TRIBUTARY OF DAVIS CREEK, TO BE APPROPRIATED UNDER APPLICATION 69550, PERMIT 50529, for IRRIGATION, TEMPERATURE CONTROL AND FLOOD HARVESTING OF CRANBERRIES. The permit to store these waters is granted under Reservoir Application R-69549 with a date of priority of MARCH 9, 1988. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year under such right, for the purposes aforesaid, shall not exceed 9.2 ACRE-FEET, BEING 4.6 ACRE-FEET FOR IRRIGATION, 1.38 ACRE-FEET FOR TEMPERATURE CONTROL AND 3.22 ACRE-FEET FOR FLOOD HARVESTING.

The dam will be located in the:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 13, T 30 S, R 15 W, WM;

The maximum height will be 9.90 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 20.0 feet, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 2:1, and height of dam above water line when full 3.0 feet. The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 1.20 acres and the maximum depth of water will be 7.5 feet.

This permit is subject to the conditions as follow:

1. Installation and maintenance of a gate valve or other suitable mechanism in the lowest flashboard, approved by the Watermaster for regulating the water.
2. All flashboards are to be removed from the spillway during the period from October 1 to April 1 of each year.
3. The dam shall be constructed under the supervision of a registered professional engineer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 27, 1990, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1990.
