THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

HEMEN-WAY FARMS 80254 SEARS ROAD COTTAGE GROVE, OREGON 97424

to construct ANIMAL WASTE POND RESERVOIR and store the waters of EFFLUENT FROM ANIMAL WASTE FLUSHING SYSTEM, a tributary of COAST FORK WILLAMETTE RIVER, to be appropriated under Application 69663, Permit, for IRRIGATION.

This Permit to store waters is issued approving Reservoir Application R-69662. The date of priority is JULY 19, 1988. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 31.7 ACRE-FEET.

The dam will be located as follows:

NE 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 11, T 20 S, R 3 W, W.M.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 3.7 acres and the maximum depth of water will be 10.0 feet.

This project was considered and approved by the Water Resources Commission on September 16, 1988.

The area to be submerged by the reservoir is described as follows:

NE 1/4 SW 1/4 SECTION 11 TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.

The permit shall be subject to conditions as follows:

- 1. The structure shall be operated and maintained in accordance with approved plans and specifications and with the design intent.
- 2. The embankment shall be kept clear of trees, brush and other debris.
- 3. The embankment shall be kept free of burrowing animals.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before DECEMBER 15, 1990, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1991. The reservoir shall be filled, and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1992.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The storage of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
