PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT A RESERVOIR AND TO
STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to construct TWO RESERVOIRS and store the waters of A SPRING STREAM AND AN UNNAMED STREAM, a tributary of BEAVER CREEK, to be appropriated and maintained under Application 69710, Permit 50947, for IRRIGATION AND FISH CULTURE.

This Permit to store waters is issued approving Reservoir Application R-69709. The date of priority is JANUARY 18, 1989. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 7.7 ACRE-FEET, being 7.0 AF in Reservoir 1 and 0.7 AF in Reservoir 2. The quantity of water to be stored from each stream for each use is 5.75 AF in Reservoir 1 for fish culture from the spring stream; 1.25 AF in Reservoir 1 for irrigation from spring stream; and 0.7 AF in Reservoir 2 for fish culture from the unnamed stream.

The reservoirs will be located as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 26, T 3 S, R 2 E, W.M.

The area submerged by the reservoirs, when full, will be 0.64 acre in Reservoir 1 and 0.1 acre in Reservoir 2. The maximum depth of water will be 11.0 feet in Reservoir 1 and 7.0 feet in Reservoir 2.

The areas to be submerged by the reservoirs are located within:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4
SECTION 26
TOWNSHIP 3 SOUTH, RANGE 2 EAST, W.M.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or the provisions of other means to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before APRIL 5, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. The reservoir shall be filled, and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The storage of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
