PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT A RESERVOIR AND TO STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

ELDON L. WILLIAMSON ROUTE 3, BOX 720 BEAVERTON, OREGON 97007

to construct WILLIAMSON RESERVOIR and store the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM, a tributary of TUALATIN RIVER, to be appropriated under Application 69169, Permit 50969, for IRRIGATION AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION.

This Permit to store waters is issued approving Reservoir Application R-69168. The date of priority is OCTOBER 27, 1989. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 38.0 ACRE-FEET.

The dam will be located as follows:

SW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 22, T 1 S, R 2 W, W.M.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 8.6 acres and the maximum depth of water will be 8.0 feet.

The area to be submerged by the reservoir is located within

SW 1/4 SW 1/4
SECTION 22
TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.

This project was considered and approved by the Water Resources Commission on May 11, 1990.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or the provision of other means to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.

All flashboards are to be removed from the spillway during the period October 1 to March 1 of each year.

The permit is subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The structure shall be modified under the supervision of a registered engineer licensed in Oregon.
- 2. The structure shall be constructed, operated and maintained in accordance with the approved plans and specifications and within the design intent.
- 3. No water shall be stored until this department receives written certification from the engineer that construction has been completed in accordance with the approved plans and specifications, and written authorization for storage is received from this department.
- 4. The outlet gate shall be cycled at least once each year in order to assure smooth operation.

- 5. The embankment and spillway channel shall be kept clear of trees and brush and other debris.
- 6. The embankment shall be kept free of burrowing animals.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before MAY 18, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. The reservoir shall be filled, and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The storage of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
