to construct THREE RESERVOIRS and store the waters of THREE UNNAMED STREAMS, tributaries of WHISKEY CREEK, for LIVESTOCK.

This Permit is issued approving Reservoir Application R-66581. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 21, 1983. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 0.18 ACRE-FOOT, BEING 0.13 AF IN UNNAMED RESERVOIR, 0.03 AF IN KODIAC RESERVOIR AND 0.02 AF IN MELVINS RESERVOIR.

The dams will be located as follows:

UNNAMED RESERVOIR - NW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 11; KODIAC RESERVOIR - SE 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 9; MELVINS RESERVOIR - NW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 10, T 37 S, R 11 E, W.M.

The area submerged by the reservoirs, when full, will be 0.08 acre in Unnamed Reservoir, 0.034 acre in Kodiac Reservoir and 0.013 acre in Melvins Reservoir. The maximum depth of water will be 4.0 feet in Unnamed Reservoir, 2.0 feet in Kodiac Reservoir and 3.0 feet in Melvins Reservoir.

The area to be submerged by the reservoirs is located within:

SECTION 11

KODIAC RESERVOIR

SE 1/4 SW 1/4 SECTION 9

MELVINS RESERVOIR

TOWNSHIP 37 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST, W.M.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or the provisions of other means to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before JULY 18, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. The reservoir shall be filled, and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The storage of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
