PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT A RESERVOIR AND TO
STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to construct DAVIS RESERVOIRS 1 AND 2 and store the waters of TWO UNNAMED STREAMS, tributaries of JOHNSON CREEK, to be appropriated under Application 69988, Permit 51033, for CRANBERRY OPERATIONS.

This Permit to store waters is issued approving Reservoir Application R-69987. The date of priority is JULY 3, 1989 FOR 3.5 AF AND APRIL 26, 1990 FOR 6.5 AF. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 10.0 ACRE-FEET, BEING 9.0 AF IN RESERVOIR 1 AND 1.0 AF IN RESERVOIR 2.

The dams will be located as follows:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 6, T 29 S, R 14 W, W.M.

The area submerged by the reservoirs, when full, will be 0.7 acre in Reservoir 1 and 0.1 acre in Reservoir 2. The maximum depth of water will be 13.0 feet in Reservoir 1 and 6.0 feet in Reservoir 2.

The area to be submerged by the reservoirs is located within:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4
SECTION 6
TOWNSHIP 29 SOUTH, RANGE 14 WEST, W.M.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or the provision of other means to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before JULY 27, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. The reservoir shall be filled, and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Q to 10-1-94, B+C ext to 10-1-96
Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The storage of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
