STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to construct CROFT LAKE RESERVOIR and store the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM, a tributary of NEW RIVER, to be maintained by appropriation under Application 70189, Permit 51064, for RECREATION.

This Permit to store waters is issued approving Reservoir Application R-70188. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 5, 1990. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 64.4 ACRE-FEET.

The dam will be located as follows:

SE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 10, T 30 S, R 15 W, W.M.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 67.0 acres and the maximum depth of water will be 1.0 foot.

The area to be submerged by the reservoir is described as follows:

SE 1/4 SE 1/4

S 1/2 SW 1/4
SECTION 11

NW 1/4 NW 1/4
SECTION 14

NE 1/4 NE 1/4
SECTION 15

TOWNSHIP 30 SOUTH, RANGE 15 WEST, W.M.

The structure shall be constructed under the supervision of a registered engineer licensed in Oregon.

The structure shall be constructed, operated and maintained in accordance with the approved plans, specifications, and the design intent.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or the provision of other means to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before AUGUST 29, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. The reservoir shall be filled, and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The storage of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
