STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE THE PUBLIC WATERS

to ALLOW DIVERSION OF GALES, CARPENTER AND KNIGHTEN CREEKS, tributaries of TUALATIN RIVER, TO SUPPLEMENT STORED WATER IN RITCHEY FARM RESERVOIR ORIGINALLY CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-8808, to be appropriated under Application 70124, Permit 51132, for NURSERY OPERATIONS.

This Permit is issued approving Reservoir Application R-70718. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 26, 1990. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year in this Reservoir under this permit along with Certificate 64282 is not more than 200.0 ACRE-FEET. Storage of natural flow is limited to the period from November 1 through April 30 of each year.

The dam will be located as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 2, T 1 S, R 4 W, W.M.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 22.0 acres and the maximum depth of water will be 10.0 feet.

The area to be submerged by the reservoir is located within:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4
SECTION 1

SE 1/4 NE 1/4
NE 1/4 SE 1/4
SECTION 2

TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or the provisions of other means to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 10, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. The reservoir shall be filled, and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

B to 10-1-92, B+C to 10-1-95
Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The storage of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
