PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT A RESERVOIR AND TO
STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO:

to construct WILDLIFE RESERVOIR and to store the waters of SOAP CREEK FLOOD WATERS, a tributary of WILLAMETTE RIVER, for WILDLIFE HABITAT.

This permit is issued approving Reservoir Application R-71524. The date of priority is APRIL 24, 1991. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 3.5 ACRE-FEET. The permittee shall appropriate water from Soap Creek from November 1 to March 31, each year only.

The dam will be located as follows:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 6, T 10 S, R 4 W, W.M.; 90 FEET SOUTH AND 1675 FEET EAST FROM SE CORNER, DLC 74.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 2.0 acres and the maximum depth of water will be 4.0 feet.

The area to be submerged by the reservoir is located within:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4
SECTION 6
TOWNSHIP 10 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or the provisions of other means to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 24, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. The reservoir shall be filled and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The storage of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including rights for maintaining instream flows.
