PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT A RESERVOIR AND TO STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO:

to construct AN UNNAMED RESERVOIR and to store the waters of GREASY CREEK, a tributary of MARYS RIVER, for RECREATION AND WILDLIFE.

This permit is issued approving Reservoir Application R-71737. The date of priority is JULY 3, 1991. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 6.0 ACRE-FEET. The appropriation of water is limited to the period of November 1 through May 31 of each year.

The dam will be located as follows:

NE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 32, T 12 S, R 6 W, W.M.

Diversion point located as follows:

NE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 32, T 12 S, R 6 W, W.M.; 732 FEET NORTH AND 887 FEET WEST FROM THE SE CORNER, NE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 32.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.9 acre and the maximum depth of water will be 8.0 feet.

The area to be submerged by the reservoir is located within:

SE 1/4 SE 1/4
SECTION 32
TOWNSHIP 12 SOUTH, RANGE 6 WEST, W.M.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or the provisions of other means to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 5, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. The reservoir shall be filled and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.
