THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO:

to construct TWO UNNAMED RESERVOIRS and to store the waters of TWO UNNAMED STREAMS, tributaries of CATCHING SLOUGH, to be appropriated under Application 71762, Permit 51382, for IRRIGATION.

This permit is issued approving Reservoir Application R-71761. The date of priority is JULY 18, 1991. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 5.0 ACRE FEET (AF), BEING 2.5 AF IN EACH RESERVOIR.

The dams will be located as follows:

SW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 6, T 26 S, R 12 W, W.M.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.5 acre each and the maximum depth of water will be 10 feet in each reservoir.

The area to be submerged by the reservoir is located within:

SW 1/4 SE 1/4
SECTION 6
TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 12 WEST, W.M.

The water user shall install and maintain an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted in an out of the reservoirs.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 16, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993.
