PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT A RESERVOIR AND TO
STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE THE PUBLIC WATERS

to construct THREE UNNAMED RESERVOIRS and to store the waters of THREE UNNAMED STREAMS, tributaries of FOUR MILE CREEK, to be appropriated under Application 71757, Permit 51459, for CRANBERRY USE.

This permit is issued approving Reservoir Application R-72045. The date of priority is NOVEMBER 25, 1991. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 15.0 ACRE-FEET, BEING 5.0 ACRE FEET IN EACH RESERVOIR. The appropriation of water for storage is limited to the period December 1 through March 31 of each year.

The dams will be located as follows:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4, NW 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 6, T 30 S, R 14 W, W.M.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

The total area proposed to be submerged by each reservoir, when full, is 0.5 acre; the proposed maximum depth of water is 12.0 feet in each reservoir. The maximum height of each dam shall not exceed 9.9 feet.

The area to be submerged by the reservoir is located within:

NE 1/4 NW 1/4
NW 1/4 NW 1/4
SECTION 6
TOWNSHIP 30 SOUTH, RANGE 14 WEST, W.M.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, with a minimum diameter of 8", or of such capacity and location as to pass the normal flow of the stream at any time.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 1, 1993, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1994. The reservoir shall be filled and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1995.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.
