PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT A RESERVOIR AND TO
STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO:

to construct AN UNNAMED RESERVOIR and to store the waters of JOHNSON CREEK, a tributary of PACIFIC OCEAN, to be appropriated under Application 69930, Permit 51487, for CRANBERRY OPERATIONS.

This permit is issued approving Reservoir Application R-69929. The date of priority is JUNE 1, 1989. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 4.0 ACRE-FEET. **Water may be appropriated for storage from November 1 through June 30 of each year.**

The dam will be located as follows:

NE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 7, T 29 S, R 14 W, W.M.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

The total area proposed to be submerged by the reservoir, when full, is 0.5 acre; the proposed maximum depth of water is 7.5 feet. The maximum height of the dam shall not exceed 10.0 feet.

The area to be submerged by the reservoir is located within:

NE 1/4 NE 1/4
SECTION 7
TOWNSHIP 29 SOUTH, RANGE 14 WEST, W.M.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, with a minimum diameter of 8 inches.

The water user is required to install and maintain an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device approved by the watermaster, for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 17, 1993, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1994. The reservoir shall be filled and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1995.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

PAGE TWO

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The storage of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.
