PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT A RESERVOIR AND TO STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO:

to construct TWO RESERVOIRS and to store the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM AND JOHNSON CREEK, tributaries of PACIFIC OCEAN, to be appropriated under Application 69928, Permit 51486, for CRANBERRY OPERATIONS.

This permit is issued approving Reservoir Application R-69927. The date of priority is JUNE 1, 1989. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 13.0 ACRE-FEET (AF), BEING 9.0 AF IN RESERVOIR 1 AND 4.0 AF IN RESERVOIR 2. Water may be appropriated for storage from November 1 through June 30 of each year.

The dams will be located as follows:

SW 1/4 NW 1/4, SECTION 9, T 29 S,R 14 W, W.M.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

The total area proposed to be submerged by reservoir 1, when full, is 1.0 acre; the proposed maximum depth of water is 9.0 feet. The maximum height of the dam shall not exceed 10.0 feet.

The total area proposed to be submerged by reservoir 0.2, when full, is 0.5 acre; the proposed maximum depth of water is 7.0 feet. The maximum height of the dam shall not exceed 10.0 feet.

The area to be submerged by the reservoir is located within:

SW 1/4 NW 1/4
SECTION 9
TOWNSHIP 29 SOUTH, RANGE 14 WEST, W.M.

The water user is required to install and maintain an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device approved by the watermaster for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted.

The water user is required to install and maintain on reservoir 2 an outlet pipe with a minimum diameter of 8 inches and an approved controlling device or shall provide other means to bypass direct flows or to evacuate the stored water.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.
