PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT A RESERVOIR AND TO
STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE THE PUBLIC WATERS

THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO:

to construct AN UNNAMED RESERVOIR and to store the waters of AN UNNAMED STREAM, a tributary of UMPQUA RIVER, for LIVESTOCK WATER.

This permit is issued approving Reservoir Application R-72666. The date of priority is SEPTEMBER 9, 1992. The amount of water entitled to be stored each year is not more than 0.1 ACRE-FOOT.

The dam will be located as follows:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 28, TOWNSHIP 23 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.;
530 FEET NORTH AND 1840 FEET WEST FROM THE SOUTHEAST CORNER DLC 44.

The total area proposed to be submerged by the reservoir, when full, is 0.1 acre; the proposed maximum depth of water is 1.5 feet. The maximum height of the dam shall not exceed 10.0 feet.

The area to be submerged by the reservoir is located within:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4
SECTION 28
TOWNSHIP 23 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.

When determined necessary by the department, the water user shall install and maintain an outlet pipe with a minimum diameter of 8 inches and an approved controlling device or shall provide other means to by-pass direct flows or to evacuate the stored water.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before DECEMBER 20, 1995 and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1996. The reservoir shall be filled and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1997.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

The permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The storage of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director of the Water Resources Department has found that the proposed use of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.
