The specific limits for the use are listed below along with conditions of use.

APPLICATION FILE NUMBER: R-75046

SOURCE OF WATER: AN UNNAMED STREAM, A TRIBUTARY OF ROCK CREEK WITHIN THE WILLAMETTE BASIN

STORAGE FACILITY: RESERVOIRS 1E, 2E, 3E, 1W, 2W

PURPOSE OR USE OF THE STORED WATER: WETLANDS CREATION AND ENHANCEMENT

AMOUNT/VOLUME ALLOWED: 1.87 ACRE-FEET TOTAL EACH YEAR, BEING 0.04 ACRE-FEET IN RESERVOIR 1E, 0.07 ACRE-FEET IN RESERVOIR 2E, 0.13 ACRE-FEET IN RESERVOIR 3E, 1.35 ACRE-FEET IN RESERVOIR 1W AND 0.28 ACRE-FEET IN RESERVOIR 2W.

THE PERIOD OF ALLOWED USE: WATER MAY BE APPROPRIATED FOR STORAGE FROM NOVEMBER 1 THROUGH APRIL 30

DATE OF PRIORITY: NOVEMBER 25, 1994

The area submerged by the reservoirs, when full, will be 0.83 acre and the maximum depth of water will be 4.0 feet. The maximum height of the dams shall not exceed 2.0 feet.

DAM LOCATION: SE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 11, TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.; 1E - 65 FEET WEST, 2E - 115 FEET NORTH AND 60 FEET WEST, 3E - UNKNOWN, 1W - 240 FEET NORTH AND 145 FEET WEST, 2W - 125 FEET NORTH AND 370 FEET WEST, ALL FROM E 1/4 CORNER SECTION 11

THE AREA TO BE SUBMERGED BY THE RESERVOIR IS LOCATED AS FOLLOWS:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4
SECTION 11
TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.

Measurement recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the permittee to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the permittee to install a meter or

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other measuring device, the permittee shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed, the permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.

- B. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, installed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife specifications.

If the riparian area is disturbed in the process of developing a point of diversion, the permittee shall be responsible for restoration and enhancement of such riparian area to the satisfaction of the Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife.

The use may be restricted if the quality of the source stream, namely the Willamette River, decreases to the point that it no longer meets state and federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an fully functional conduit/gate assembly having a minimum diameter of 8 inches.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.


By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds that the proposed use(s) of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Actual construction work shall begin within one year from permit issuance and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1998. The reservoir shall be filled and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1999.
