SOURCE OF WATER: AN UNNAMED STREAM, A TRIBUTARY OF NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, AND NORTH UMPQUA RIVER, A TRIBUTARY OF UMPQUA RIVER, TO BE APPROPRIATED UNDER APPLICATION S-70084, PERMIT 52686, FOR IRRIGATION

STORAGE FACILITY: "THE BENCH" RESERVOIR

PURPOSE OR USE OF THE STORED WATER: TO BE APPROPRIATED UNDER APPLICATION S-70084, PERMIT 52686 FOR IRRIGATION

AMOUNT OF STORAGE: 9.1 ACRE-FEET (AF), BEING 3.0 AF EACH YEAR FROM AN UNNAMED STREAM ONLY AND 6.1 AF EACH YEAR FROM AN UNNAMED STREAM WITH ANY DEFICIENCY TO BE MADE UP FROM NORTH UMPQUA RIVER

WATER MAY BE APPROPRIATED FOR STORAGE DURING THE PERIOD NOVEMBER 1 THROUGH APRIL 30 OF EACH YEAR

DATE OF PRIORITY: SEPTEMBER 29, 1989 FOR 3.0 AF; MARCH 8, 1991 FOR 6.1 AF

THE AREA SUBMERGED BY THE RESERVOIR, WHEN FULL, WILL BE 2.5 ACRES AND THE MAXIMUM DEPTH OF WATER WILL BE 9.0 FEET. THE MAXIMUM HEIGHT OF THE DAM SHALL NOT EXCEED 9.9 FEET.

DAM LOCATION: SW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 13, T26S, R4E, W.M.; 380 FEET NORTH & 790 FEET EAST FROM THE SW CORNER OF SECTION 13

THE AREA TO BE SUBMERGED BY THE RESERVOIR IS LOCATED WITHIN THE SW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 13, TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the permittee to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the permittee to install a meter or other measuring device, the permittee shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless

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special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed, the permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.

- B. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The permittee shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion on the North Umpqua River. The permittee shall not construct, operate or maintain any dam or artificial obstruction to fish passage in the channel of North Umpqua River unless a fishway is provided. The applicant is hereby directed to contact a ODFW Fish Passage Program coordinator, Portland, Oregon, before beginning construction of any in-channel obstruction.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of a fully functional conduit/gate assembly having a minimum diameter of 8 inches.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds that the proposed use(s) of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Actual construction work shall begin within one year from permit issuance and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1998. The reservoir shall be filled and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1999.
