APPLICATION FILE NUMBER: R-73795

SOURCE OF WATER: AN UNNAMED DRAINAGE, A TRIBUTARY OF WEST FORK DAIRY CREEK

STORAGE FACILITY: AN UNNAMED RESERVOIR

PURPOSE OR USE OF THE STORED WATER: WILDLIFE SANCTUARY AND IRRIGATION, TO BE APPROPRIATED UNDER APPLICATION S-73796, PERMIT 52665

ALLOWED QUANTITY OF USE: 9.0 ACRE-FEET EACH YEAR

PERIOD OF ALLOWED USE: WATER MAY BE APPROPRIATED FOR STORAGE FROM NOVEMBER 1 THROUGH APRIL 30

DATE OF PRIORITY: DECEMBER 17, 1993

THE AREA SUBMERGED BY THE RESERVOIR, WHEN FULL, WILL BE 6.0 ACRES AND THE MAXIMUM DEPTH OF WATER WILL BE 2.0 FEET. THE MAXIMUM HEIGHT OF THE DAM SHALL NOT EXCEED 8.0 FEET.

DAM LOCATION: NW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 17, T1N, R3W, W.M.; 380 FEET EAST FROM THE W 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 17 TO THE NW CORNER OF TAX LOT 800, THEN 486 FEET EAST

THE AREA TO BE SUBMERGED BY THE RESERVOIR IS LOCATED AS FOLLOWS:

NW 1/4 SW 1/4
SECTION 17
TOWNSHIP 1 NORTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.

Measurement recording and reporting conditions:

- A. The Director may require the permittee to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the permittee to install a meter or other measuring device, the permittee shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period.

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Once installed, the permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.

- B. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or the provision of other means to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.

Installation of a larger diameter outlet conduit may be required. Should a larger outlet conduit be required at some later date to satisfy priority water distribution needs, one shall be installed using appropriate safeguards and construction techniques, or the structure may be breached or reconstructed.

If the riparian area is disturbed in the process of developing a point of diversion, the permittee shall be responsible for restoration and enhancement of such riparian area to the satisfaction of the Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife.

The use may be restricted if the quality of the source stream, namely the Willamette River, decreases to the point that it no longer meets state and federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.


By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds that the proposed use(s) of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Actual construction work shall begin within one year from permit issuance and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1998. The reservoir shall be filled and complete application of the stored water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1999.
