PURPOSE OR USE OF THE STORED WATER: STORM WATER DETENTION AND WETLAND ENHANCEMENT

MAXIMUM STORAGE VOLUME: 2.9 ACRE-FEET EACH YEAR

WATER MAY BE APPROPRIATED FOR STORAGE DURING THE PERIOD: NOVEMBER 1 THROUGH JUNE 30 OF EACH YEAR

DATE OF PRIORITY: SEPTEMBER 7, 1995

THE MAXIMUM HEIGHT OF THE DAM SHALL NOT EXCEED 0.0 FEET (GROUNDLEVEL).

DAM LOCATION: SE 1/4 SE 1/4 SECTION 31, T178, R2W, W.M.; NE 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 6, T18S, R2W; NORTH 74°39 EAST 1546 FEET FROM THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF DLC 56

THE AREA TO BE SUBMERCED BY THE RESERVOIR IS LOCATED AS FOLLOWS:

SE 1/4 SE 1/4 SECTION 31

TOWNSHIP IV SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.

NE 1/4 NE 1/4

SECTION 6
TOWNSHIP 18 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

A. The Director may require the permittee to install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. If the Director notifies the permittee to install a meter or other measuring device, the permittee shall install such device within the period stated in the notice. Such installation period shall not be less than 90 days unless

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special circumstances warrant a shorter installation period. Once installed, the permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order and shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device. Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative measuring procedures for review and approval.

The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a В. record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of The Director may provide an water under the permit. opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or the provision of other means to evacuate water when determined necessary by the Water Resources Director to satisfy prior downstream rights.

Diversion screening or fish passage facilities shall be designed, and operated to Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife installed, specifications.

The total area to be submerged by the reservoir, when full shall be 1.2 acre; the maximum depth of water shall be 3.0 feet.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The Director finds that the proposed use(s) of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Actual construction work shall begin within one year from permit issuance. The reservoirs shall be filled and complete application of water shall be made on or before October 1, 2001.

This permit is issued to correctly describe the place of use and point of diversion locations. Permit R-12306, dated October 31, 1997, is superseded by this instrument and is of no further force or effect.


APPLICATION WATER RIGHT MAP
