PURPOSE OR USE OF THE STORED WATER: RECREATION USE

MAXIMUM VOLUME: 11.0 ACRE FEET EACH YEAR

PERIOD OF USE: NOVEMBER 1 THROUGH APRIL 30

DATE OF PRIORITY: JUNE 30, 2003

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 6.46 ACRES. The maximum height of the dam shall not exceed 12.0 FEET.

DAM LOCATION: LOT 5 (NW & SW. **), SECTION 28, T1N, R1W, W.M.; 1760 FEET NORTH & 1320 FEET EAST FROM SW CORNER, SECTION 28

THE AREA TO BE SUBMERGED BY THE RESERVOIR IS LOCATED AS FOLLOWS:

DOT 3 (NE 4 SW 4) LOT 5 (NW 4 SW 4)

SECTION 28

TOWNSHIP 1 NORTH, RANGE 1 WEST, W.M.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the water user shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The water user shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.

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- B. The water user shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the water user to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the water user to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the water user to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the water user to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

If the riparian area is disturbed in the process of developing a point of diversion, the water user shall be responsible for restoration and enhancement of such riparian area in accordance with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) Fish and Wildlife Habitat Mitigation Policy OAR Chapter 635, Division 415. For purposes of mitigation, the ODFW Fish and Wildlife Habitat Mitigation Goals and Standards, OAR Chapter 635, Division 415, Section 030 adopted November 13, 1991 shall be followed.

The use may be restricted if the quality of the source stream or downstream waters decrease to the point that those waters no longer meet existing state or federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

The water user shall install, maintain, and operate fish screening and by-pass devices consistent with current Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) standards. Fish screening is to prevent fish from entering the proposed diversion while by-pass devices provide adequate upstream and downstream passage for fish. The required screens and by-pass devices are to be in place, functional, and approved in writing by ODFW prior to diversion of any water. The water user may submit evidence in writing that ODFW has determined screens and/or by-pass devices are not necessary.

STANDARD CONDITIONS

Use under this permit is limited to the reservoir area. This permit does not provide for the appropriation of water for maintaining the water level or maintaining a suitable fresh water condition.

The storage of water allowed herein is subject to the installation and maintenance of a fully functional conduit/gate assembly having a minimum diameter of 8 inches.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water allowed herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights, including prior rights for maintaining instream flows.

The reservoir shall be filled and complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 2009. If the water is not completely applied before this date, and the water user wishes to continue development under the permit, the water user must submit an application for extension of time, which may be approved based upon the merit of the application.

Within one year after complete application of water to the proposed use, the water user shall submit a claim of beneficial use, which includes a map and report, prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner (CWRE).

ASSIGNMENT OF PERMIT: Pursuant to ORS 537.220, this permit may be assigned to a party other than the water user named hereon, if the land the permit is associated with changes ownership, or if the water user is an organization whose name changes as a result of sale or merger. 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MAILING ADDRESS CHANGES: If the mailing address of the water user named hereon changes, it is important that the Oregon Water Resources Department be informed of the change. Address changes must be submitted in writing with the water user's signature to Water Right Application Section, Oregon Water Resources Department, 725 Summer St NE Ste A, Salem OR 97301-1271.

REAL ESTATE TRANSACTIONS: Pursuant to ORS 537.330, in any transaction for the conveyance of real estate that includes any portion of the lands described in this permit, the seller of the real estate shall, upon accepting an offer to purchase that real estate, also inform the purchaser in writing whether any permit, transfer approval order, or certificate evidencing the water right is available and that the seller will deliver any permit, transfer approval order or certificate to the purchaser at closing, if the permit, transfer approval order or certificate is available.

CULTURAL RESOURCES PROTECTION LAWS: Water users involved in grounddisturbing activities should be aware of federal and state cultural resources protection laws. ORS 358.920 prohibits the excavation, injury, destruction or alteration of an archeological site or object, or removal of archeological objects from public and private lands without an archeological permit issued by the State Historic Preservation Office. 16 USC 470, Section 106, National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 requires a federal agency, prior to any undertaking to take into account the effect of the undertaking that is included on or eligible for inclusion in the National Register.
