PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-58594 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife of 506 Southwest Mill Street, Portland, Oregon 97201, phone 229-5702, for the construction of Cleary Reservoir and storage of water from Cleary Creek to be appropriated under Application 58595, Permit 47242, for irrigation. The dam shall be constructed under the supervision of a registered professional engineer.

The dam will be LOCATED in the: SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 35, Township 17 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Lane.

The maximum height will be 7.5 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 10.0 feet. slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 3:1, and height of dam above water line when full 2.5 feet.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 6.2 acres, and the maximum depth of water will be 5.0 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet or bypass and control works are: Outlet structure will be 18-inch corrugated metal pipe with gate through dike.

The structure is out of the channel of the drainageway.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 30.0 acre-feet.

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is April 30, 1979

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 14, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1986.
