PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-61054 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Jimmy and Jacqueline Arn of 16250 South Wilson Road, Oregon City, Oregon, 97045, phone 632-4318, for the construction of a reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed stream, tributary of Beaver Creek to Willamette, to be appropriated under Application 61055, Permit 47403 for irrigation and stock water.

The dam will be LOCATED in the: SW 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 23, Township 3 South, Range 2 East, in the County of Clackamas.

The maximum height will be 6 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 10 inches slope of upstream face, slope of downstream face 45%, and height of dam above water line when full 1 foot.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.25 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 6 feet.

The locations and dimensions of the spillway are: bottom width 6 feet, top width 6 feet, depth is at present 1 foot.

The location and dimensions of the outlet conduit will be: 12-inch cement pipe on northeast corner of pond.

The structure is out of the channel.

The dam will be U-shaped of concrete construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 1.0 acre-foot, being 0.5 acre-foot for each use.

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is February 24, 1983.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 29, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1986.
