CONSTRUCT A RESERVOIR AND TO STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE

PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-64965 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to David R. Berry of 3249 Ross Inlet Road, Coos Bay, Oregon 97420, phone 267-3900, for the construction of a reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed stream, tributary Ross Slough to be appropriated under Application 64966, Permit 47558 for irrigation,

NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 13, Township 26 South, Range 13 West, The dam will be LOCATED in the: WM, in the County of Coos.

8.0 The maximum height will be feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 10 feet , slope of upstream face 2:1 2:1 , slope of downstream face , and height of dam above water line when full 1.5 feet

0.14 acre , and the maximum depth of water will be 7.0 feet. The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be

The locations and dimensions of the spillway are: none

The location and dimensions of the outlet conduit will be: Located near center of dam with flowline 2.5 feet below dam crest. Conduit is 12-inche plastic pipe that extends through dam and to bottom of the downstream face.

The structure is in the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 0.55 acre-foot.

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is March 30, 1983

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 27, 1984 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85 . Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 n/a.
