PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-64942 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to John Griffin of 14875 Southeast 262nd, Boring, Oregon 97009, phone 663-5484, for the construction of a reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed spring to be appropriated under Application 64943, Permit 47490 for irrigation.

The dam will be LOCATED in the: NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 11, Township 2 South, Range 3 East, WM, in the County of Clackamas.

The maximum height will be 9.9 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 20 feet, slope of upstream face 2:1, slope of downstream face 3:1, and height of dam above water line when full 2.5 feet.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.1 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 10 feet.

The locations and dimensions of the spillway are: Bottom width 8 feet, top width 10 feet, the distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway 2.5 feet.

The location and dimensions of the outlet conduit will be: A 12-inch conduit through the dam.

The structure is in the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 1.0 acre-foot

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is March 21, 1983

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 13, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 n/a.
