PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-59090 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Bureau of Land Management of Box 700, Vale, Oregon 97918, phone (503)-473-3144, for the enlargement of Lower Dug Out Creek Reservoir construction under Permit R-3368 and storage of water from Dug Out Creek, tributary of Malheur River for wildlife and livestock and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored water when determined by the Water Resources *

The dam will be LOCATED in the: SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 22, Township 21 South, Range 38 East, WM, in the County of Malheur.

The maximum height will be 12.8 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 12 feet, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 2:1, and height of dam above water line when full 4 feet.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be .29 acres, and the maximum depth of water will be 8.0 feet.

* Director to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The locations and dimensions of the spillway are: Bottom width 18 feet, top width 37.5 feet, the distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway 4 feet.

The location and dimensions of the outlet conduit will be: none.

The structure is out of the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 1.37 acre-feet.

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is August 6, 1979.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 29, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 n/a.
