CONSTRUCT A RESERVOIR AND TO STORE FOR BENEFICIAL USE PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-65076 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Karl H. and Helga C. Moll of 16084 South Forsythe Road, Oregon City, Oregon 97045, phone 655-1009 (Home), 655-6344 (Office), for the construction of a reservoir and storage of water from Ives Creek, to be appropriated under Application 65077, Permit 47608 for irrigation,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: S 1/2 NE 1/4 of Section 24, Township 8 South, Range 25 East, WM, in the County of Wheeler.

The maximum height will be 9.9 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 8.0, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 2:1, and height of dam above water line when full 2.5 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 2.0 acres, and the maximum depth of water will be 12.0 feet

The locations and dimensions of the spillway are: None.

The location and dimensions of the outlet conduit will be: Off-channel reservoir; 6-inch outlet pipe to sprinkler irrigation by gravity pressure.

The structure is out of the channel.

The dam will be excavation and earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 9.2 acre-feet

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is May 9, 1983

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 25, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 n/a.
