**PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE
for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS**

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-58694 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Glenn Walters Nursery, an Amfac Corporation of Route 3, Box 142, Hillsboro, Oregon 97123, phone 640-4633, for the construction of Ritchey Farm Reservoir and storage of sewage effluent from Forest Grove Sewage Treatment Plant to be appropriated under Application 64769, Permit 47713 for irrigation, and the dam shall be constructed under the supervision of a registered professional engineer,
The dam will be LOCATED in the: NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 2, Township 1 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Washington.

The maximum height will be 12.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 12.0 feet, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 2:1, and height of dam above water line when full 3.0 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 22.0 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 10.0 feet

The locations and dimensions of the spillway are: None.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: 18-inch CMP with flow line 2.5 feet below crest.

The structure is out of the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 200.0 acre-feet

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is May 22, 1979

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 28, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985
