## PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-65266 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to James C. Keding and Edith L. Keding of 17390 Williams Highway, Grants Pass, Oregon 97526, phone 846-6877, for the construction of a reservoir and storage of waste and seepage water to be appropriated under Application 64167, Permit 47765 for irrigation, tributary of Williams Creek

The dam will be LOCATED in the: W 1/2 NW 1/4 of Section 24, Township 38 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Josephine.

The maximum height will be  $\mathbf{n/a}$  feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be  $\mathbf{n/a}$  , slope of upstream face  $\mathbf{n/a}$  , slope of downstream face  $\mathbf{n/a}$  , and height of dam above water line when full  $\mathbf{n/a}$ 

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.5 acre , and the maximum depth of water will be 16.0 feet

The locations and dimensions of the spillway are: n/a.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: n/a.

The structure is out of the channel.

The reservoir will be excavated.

\* storage from Unnamed Stream 2.

Application cons

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 9.1 acre-feet, being 9.1 af from Unnamed Stream 1 with any deficiency in the available supply of water from Unnamed Stream 1 to be made up by\*
The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is July 5, 1983

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 8, 1984 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 as .
