PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-65481 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Richard Caddock of 1606 Wild River Drive, Roseburg, Oregon 97470, phone 496-3501, for the construction of an unnamed reservoir and storage of water from North Umpqua River to be maintained by appropriation of water under provisions of an order of the Water Resources Director entered November 1, 1983, approving the transfer Application 5334 for fish rearing,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 14, Township 26 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

3.0 The maximum height will be feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 30.0 feet , slope of upstream face 3:1 , slope of downstream face 3:1 , and height of dam above water line when full 3.0 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.52 acre , and the maximum depth of water will be 15.0 feet

The locations and dimensions of the spillway are: A 12-inch culvert will act as possible spillway in the event water level raises above ground level.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The structure is out of the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction and excavation.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 5.2 acre-feet

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is August 1, 1983

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 17, 1984 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985 .
