## PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-66011 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Greg Ballard of Route 1, Box 122-D, Gaston, Oregon 97119, phone 357-5993, for the construction of a reservoir, a tributary of Tualatin River and storage of water from Johnson Creek to be appropriated under Application 65194, Permit 47890 for irrigation

The dam will be LOCATED in the: SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 23, Township I South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Washington.

The maximum height will be 9.9 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 8.0 feet , slope of upstream face 3:1 , slope of downstream face 2:1 , and height of dam above water line when full 2.5 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.38 acre , and the maximum depth of water will be 8.0 feet

The locations and dimensions of the spillway are: Bottom width 4.0 feet, top width 4.0 feet, the distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway 2.5 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: To be in Johnson Creek stream bed and constructed of concrete cast in place. Dimensions to be 2.5 feet by 2.5 feet by 10.0 feet long through concrete central core of dam.

The structure is in channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 1.5 acre-feet

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is September 9, 1983 .

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **December 2, 1984**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985. Extended to Oct. 1, 1986
