### PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **R-66053** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to **Patrick Michael Leonard and Christine Westphal of Box 17, Starveout Creek Road, Azalea, Oregon 97410**, for the construction of a reservoir, a tributary of Starveout Creek, and storage of water from an unnamed stream to be appropriated under **Application 66054, Permit 48053** for irrigation,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: **NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 18, Township 32 South, Range 4 West, in the County of Douglas.**

The maximum height will be **3.0** feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be **20.0 feet**, slope of upstream face **3:1**, slope of downstream face **2:1**, and height of dam above water line when full **2.5 feet**

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be **0.10 acre**, and the maximum depth of water will be **9.0 feet.**

**The locations and dimensions of the spillway are: Bottom width 1.5 feet, top width 2.0 feet, the distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway 2.5 feet.**

**The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: 6 inch pipe.**

**The structure is in channel.**

**The dam will be earthfill construction.**

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of **0.70 acre-foot**

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is **September 14, 1983**.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **January 16, 1985**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985.
