### PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **R-67353** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to **Lynn E. and Rose M. Cannon of 886 North Dean Street, Coquille, Oregon 97423, phone 396-3783**, for the construction of a reservoir, a tributary of Davis Creek, and storage of water from an unnamed stream to be appropriated under Application 67354, Permit 48192 for irrigation,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: **NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 13, Township 30 South, Range 15 West, WM, in the County of Coos.**

The maximum height will be **8.0** feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be **10.0 feet**, slope of upstream face **3:1**, slope of downstream face **2:1**, and height of dam above water line when full **4.0 feet**

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be **0.25 acre**, and the maximum depth of water will be **7.0 feet**

The location and dimension of the spillway is: The spillway will be a round culvert, 18 inches. The distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway will be 4.0 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduits will be: A four inch plastic conduit will be located at streambed level.

The structure is in channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of **1.5 acre-feet**

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is **October 5, 1983**.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **February 15, 1985**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **85**.
