## PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

R-63365 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to USDA, Forest Service, Umatilla National Forest of 2517 SW Hailey Avenue, Pendleton, Oregon 97801, phone 276-3811, for the construction of Northside Reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed intermittent stream, tributary to North Fork Meacham Creek, for livestock and wildlife and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored water when determined by the Water\* The dam will be LOCATED in the: NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 29, Township 1 North, Range 37 East, WM, in the County of Umatilla.

1.5 The maximum height will be feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 5.0 feet 3:1 , slope of downstream face 3:1 , and height of dam above water , slope of upstream face line when full 1.0 foot

0.003 acre , and the maximum depth of water will be 1.5 feet. The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: Around the dam, bottom width 3.0 feet, top width 3.0 feet, the distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway 1.0 foot.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The structure is in channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 0.002 acre-foot

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is March 1, 1982

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 24, 1985 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85 .
