PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-65477 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Virgel L. Clark of 13940 Maxfield Creek Road, Monmouth, Oregon 97361, phone 838-5033 or 689-8857, for the construction of a reservoir and storage of water from hillside runoff and intermittent springs, tributaries of Airlie Creek for recreation,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 6, Township 10 South, Range 5 West, WM. in the County of Polk.

6.0 The maximum height will be feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 8.0+ feet , slope of upstream face n/a , slope of downstream face \ \Pi/a , and height of dam above water line when full 2.5 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.16 acre , and the maximum depth of water will be 8.0 feet

The location and dimension of the spillway is: 3.0 feet by 3.0 feet concrete drop inlet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: 18 inches galvanized steel through base of dam.

The structure is out of the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 0.99 acre-foot

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is July 29, 1983

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 6, 1985 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85. Extended to Oct. 1, 1986
