PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R=65864 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to USDI, Bureau of Land Management of PO Box 151, Lakeview, Oregon 97630, phone 947-2177, for the construction of Big Dobie Waterhole (3539) Reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed intermittent stream, tributary to Miller Creek for livestock and wildlife and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored water when determined* The dam will be LOCATED in the: SW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 35, Township 39 South, Range 13 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.

The maximum height will be n/a feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be n/a , slope of downstream face n/a , and height of dam above water line when full n/a

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.2 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 10.0 feet

* by the Water Resources Director to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The location and dimension of the spillway is: n/a

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The structure is in channel.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 1.0 acre-foot

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is September 2, 1983.
