PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-67670 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to US, Bureau of Land Management of PO Box 151, Lakeview, Oregon 97630, phone 947-2177, for the construction of Bunchgrass Butte (4986) Reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed intermittent stream, tributary to Paulina Marsh, for livestock and wildlife and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored *

The dam will be LOCATED in the: NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 18, Township 29 South, Range 15 East, WM, in the County of Lake.

The maximum height will be 9.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 10.0 feet, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 2:1, and height of dam above water line when full 3.5 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 1.0 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 5.0 feet

* water when determined by the Water Resources Director to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: Around the dam, bottom width 14.0 feet, top width 18.0 feet, the distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway 3.5 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The structure is in channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 2.5 acre-feet

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is October 13, 1983 .

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 16, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985 .
